

PRIORITIZED METHODS OF COMMUNICATIONS

Most desirable option is listed first and least desirable option is listed last:

DSN	<i>CONUS DSN</i>	8 - # - DSN Number
DSN OP	<i>OCONUS OPERATOR</i>	8 - # - 564 - 0111
OPX/IVG	<i>OCONUS DSN (In AOR)</i>	82 - 94 - DSN Country Code - DSN Number
OPX/IVG	<i>Washington local calls</i>	82 - 93 - 1 - Area Code - Number
OPX/IVG	<i>Embassies Worldwide</i>	82 - 5- 4 Digit Extension
FTS2001	<i>CONUS Long Distance</i>	6 - 1 - Area Code - Number
Commercial	<i>Local calls (All Florida Keys)</i>	9 - Local Number
MCIW	<i>International Direct Dial</i>	6 - 011 - Country Code - Number
INMARSAT	<i>Ships at sea</i>	6 - 011 - Satellite Region - Number

The 6 - 011 capability is to be used as a means of last resort due to the prohibitive costs incurred
