



WELCOME ABOARD NAVAL AIR STATION KEY WEST, FLORIDA

Naval Air Station Key West, Florida, is the U.S. Navy's premier training station for tactical aviation squadrons. Local aerial ranges enable aviators to engage in training maneuvers within minutes of takeoff. This saves fuel, time and tax dollars. The station is equipped with a sophisticated tactical combat training system, similar to the one depicted in the popular 1986 movie "Top Gun," which tracks and records combat aerial maneuvers. Training officers can use this system to watch their students' flight performances in real-time, and students can watch and critique their own flight performances on screen after training sessions. As a host station, NASKW provides and maintains facilities and services for tenants and ensures quality of life for personnel. The station is located within a national marine sanctuary. Mission is carefully integrated with the environment and in concert with the community.

CHECK-IN

All newly arriving personnel with orders to report to Naval Air Station Key West will first need to report to Boca Chica Field on U.S. 1 at mile marker (MM) 8.

DIRECTIONS

Airport to Boca Chica Field

Turn left on S. Roosevelt Boulevard. Turn right on U.S. 1 (second light). Take ramp to right just before MM8. (Sign posted "Naval Air Station Next Right")

Mainland Florida to Boca Chica Take U.S. 1 to MM8.

Take ramp to right.

(Sign posted "Naval Air Station Next Right")

COMMAND HISTORY



The military presence in Key West dates to 1823 when a U.S. naval base was established, commanded by Commodore David Porter, to suppress piracy in the surrounding waters. To combat pirates in the shallow waters around the region, Porter used an old New York steam ferryboat, the Sea Gull, to tow sailor-manned barges to cut off pirate escape routes. This was the first instance of a steam-propelled vessel being used in the Navy.

During the Civil War, more ships were stationed at Key West than at any other port in the United States. Key West remained in Union control during the war, which prevented the Confederacy from receiving much-needed war supplies from overseas. In 1898, the battleship Maine sailed from Key West to Havana Harbor where the ship's loss sparked the Spanish American War. Once again, every available naval vessel was sent to Key West for the American war effort. The nation's southernmost naval base proved to be an ideal year-round training facility with rapid access to the open sea lanes and ideal flying conditions.

During World War I, the Navy's forces expanded to include seaplanes, submarines and blimps. Ground was broken for construction of a small coastal air patrol station on July 13, 1917, at what is now Trumbo Point, on land leased from the Florida East Coast Railroad Co.

On Sept. 22 of that year, the base's logbook recorded the first naval flight ever made from Key West — a Curtiss N-9 sea plane flown by Coast Guard Lt. Stanley Parker. About three months later, on Dec. 18, Naval Air Base Key West was commissioned and Parker became the first commanding officer. The base was primarily used for anti-submarine patrol operations and as an elemental flight training station.

More than 500 aviators were trained at the station during World War I.

NAS Key West was placed in a caretaker status during the 1920s and '30s. However, in 1939, as war appeared likely, activity at NAS Key West increased. More patrol and antisubmarine aircraft, as well as Navy destroyers, arrived with President Franklin D. Roosevelt's signing of the Neutrality Act. The seaplane base on Trumbo Point was redesignated NAS Key West on Dec. 15, 1940, and served as an operating and training base for fleet aircraft squadrons. Other satellite facilities were established to support other war efforts, including Meacham Field for lighter-than-air operations on Key West, and a runway for land-based aircraft on Boca Chica. In March 1945, the satellite fields were disestablished and combined into one aviation activity designated as U.S. Naval Air Station Key West.

COMMAND HISTORY

After the war ended, NAS Key West was retained as a training facility. It responded to the 1962 Cuban missile crisis, which posed the first doorstep threat to the United States in more than a century. Reconnaissance and operational flights were begun Oct. 22, 1962, in support of the blockade around Cuba. During the Cuban crisis, Key West cemented its claim to the title "Gibraltar of the Gulf," coined a hundred years earlier by Porter.

NAS Key West's national security mission supports operational and readiness requirements for the Department of Defense, Department of Homeland Security, National Guard units, federal agencies and Allied forces.

What makes the southernmost air station attractive to the war fighter is access to unencumbered air space and sea space, the Tactical Combat Training System, year-round great weather, the piers/harbor, the visitor quarters complex and the Gulf range complex. As such, NAS Key West is the Navy's premier East Coast transient pilot training facility for tactical aviation squadrons. The airfield hosts aviation squadrons from across the country regularly to fulfill the mission.

NAS Key West encompasses more than 5,800 acres in the Lower Keys, and the Gulf water and air ranges span 30,000 square miles. Air station facilities can support up to 100 aircraft and more

than 800 personnel at one time, as well as provide port operations for visiting ships. More than 30 tenant commands call Key West home.



Located in Building V-4058 on Sigsbee Road, the Fleet & Family Support Center provides programs and counseling to support individual and




Beachside Grill and Truman Fitness Center

Located on Boca Chica Key, Naval Air Station Key West is located 4 miles northeast of Key West proper. Known as "the Caribbean of the United States," the Keys are as close as you can get to paradise without leaving the country. Due to the Keys' proximity to both Cuba and the Caribbean, their history is as colorful as their inhabitants. The area has sheltered Spanish conquistadors, French pirates, Caribbean salvagers, Cuban shipbuilders and East Coast sailors. In fact, many of the structures built on the Keys date to the 1850s, and many of the land titles and deeds were issued from the King of Spain. The surrounding communities offer so many unique sights and activities — each Key is a veritable "Treasure Island" for you to explore.

KEY WEST

Key West has a longstanding reputation as being the premier tourist and vacation destination as the southernmost city in the continental United States. However, Key West has a lot more to offer than just sun, beaches and surf. Architecture, history and adventure are on the menu year-round. And let's not forget Key limes, pineapples and "pink gold" (shrimp). The former mayor of Key West began a campaign to establish Key West as "the cleanest little city in America" — a plan that will boost the foundations of the island, thus improving its overall appearance. From mentoring and youth athletic sponsorship, to physically cleaning and tending to the island, Key West's citizens have answered the call to strengthen the island as a whole.

History

With the arrival of Ponce de Leon in 1521, the isle was named "Cayo Hueso," or "Isle of Bones," upon landing because the ground was scattered with the bones of Native Americans — it was later learned to be a native burial ground. The term "Key West" is actually an English mispronunciation of Cayo Hueso, so named in 1822 when a small naval depot was established. Prior to U.S. occupation, the island chain was a haven for criminals and pirates, as well as Native Americans. The island's two earliest industries were fishing and salvage. The salvage industry made Key West the largest and most prosperous city in Florida due to the large reefs flanking the island. Literally hundreds of trade ships struck and sank on the reefs, and divers salvaged millions of dollars' worth of riches. To this day, the coast of Key West is one of the most dived locations in the world due to the ships still sunken close to the coast. However, from 1890 to 1935, the island's population steadily declined, and construction/industries all but ceased. In turn, World War II brought a population boom and industry increase. The area's population more

than doubled between 1940 and 1960. However, after 1960, bases shut down nationwide, and Key West was no exception. Cyclical yet again, from 1960 to 1980 population declined slightly less than 30 percent. By 1990, the population was on the rise yet again (from 24,377 to 24,832), and currently the population has reached a plateau of approximately 25,200.

Architecture

Key West has several bohemian-styled structures that are more than a century old, including tin-roofed Conch-style homes, gingerbread houses and faithfully restored wooden homes built in the style of the island's original visionaries. Several world-famous people have called Key West home, from Lou Gehrig to Thomas Edison to Tennessee Williams, and many of their former homes are available to tour and photograph.

Attractions

In the historic Bahama Village (settled in the 19th century by immigrants from the Bahamas), new stores and restaurants are springing up seemingly overnight. This area was a favorite of Ernest Hemingway, who was known to frequent the bars to arm-wrestle and box with the locals. The Mallory docks are a likely source for nighttime entertainment for islanders and tourists alike. Sidewalk cafes, open-air bars and dimly lit pubs line the streets, which are filled with jugglers, mimes and a multitude of street musicians. Some of the top attractions for tourists include the following.

Conch Tour Train

This world-famous tour of Key West takes you to Truval Village, near the Hemingway Home and Museum, Flagler Station and many other interesting and historical sights.

Shipwreck Treasure Museum

Discover the treacherous world of shipwreck salvaging and how it made Key West the richest city in the Florida Keys.

Key West Cemetery

A walk through this historic graveyard can tell as much about Key West's eccentric character as any history lesson. Unusual whitewashed aboveground tombs and unique statutes are perfect indicators of the Keys' colorful past.

Trolley Tours

Enjoy sightseeing tours of Key West, featuring more than 100 points of interest. The trolleys make stops along the way for shopping, attractions and dining nearby, including:

Audubon House and Tropical Gardens

Tour the 1840s restored home of Captain Geiger. This has a 1-acre garden with a great collection of tropical plants.





- · Custom House Museum and Cultural Center
- Built in 1891, the Custom House Museum explores Key West's history.
- Ernest Hemingway Home and Museum This gem is one of Key West's most popular tourist attractions.
- Little White House See the "Winter White House" of former President Harry S. Truman.
- Key West Historic Memorial
- Sculpture Garden See the bronze busts of Ernest Hemingway, Asa Tift and Harry S. Truman.
- Mallory Square Sunset Celebration Enjoy a nightly sunset celebration. Be entertained by various carnival performers and street vendors while viewing a sunset, the likes of which you'll see nowhere else.

Family Attractions

Key West also offers several attractions geared primarily toward children and families:

Astro City

This well-equipped playground is a popular stop for families on their way to and from the beach, Edward B. Knight/White Street Pier or Old Town Key West.

Bayview Park

This large park has a fully equipped playground, basketball court and tennis courts. It is a popular spot for local events.

Edward B. Knight (formerly White Street Pier)

This pier extends hundreds of yards over the Atlantic Ocean. When winds are calm or out of the north, a stroll along this pier reveals large schools of fish and numerous feeding shore birds. The end of the pier is a good spot for family fishing excursions.

Historic Seaport District

A public walkway was built around this former commercial-fishing harbor. This is a great place to take a stroll with your family. Children might find a wild sea turtle or see hungry tarpons and occasionally manatees from the walkway.

Fort Zachary Taylor State Park and Beach

This historic fortress at the southwest end of Key West is a fascinating place for children to play and watch boats as they sail out of Key West Harbor. The grounds offer a sandy beach with picnic tables and restrooms.

Key West Aquarium

See jellyfish, sharks and other marine mammals at this popular attraction. A touch tank features sea stars, giant hermit crabs, horseshoe crabs and more.

Beaches

Though Key West is known as a tropical paradise, don't expect to find white-sand beaches this far south. Though somewhat rocky, the beaches are lush nonetheless and offer many activities year-round. Here's a small offering of some local beaches most accessible to swimming, surfing and sunbathing.



- C.B. Harvey Rest Beach Picnic areas, hiking and bike trails — a perfect family spot.
- Higgs Beach/Astro City Park The premier beach for sunbathing on the Key.
- Simonton Street Beach An excellent location to watch sailing vessels.
- Smathers Beach Best spot for both surfing and windsurfing.
- South Beach Popular beach for tourists.
- Dog Beach One of the only local beaches where dogs are welcome.

Weather

Key West has a mild tropical climate nearly year-round, due mainly to its proximity to the Florida current. At its coldest, winter is only an average of 15 degrees cooler than summer. However, there are only two major seasons: dry and wet. The "dry season" lasts December through April, and the "wet season" runs May through October. During the wet season, the Keys receive more than 75 percent of their annual rainfall. Hurricane season runs tandem with the rainy season, from June through October, with the most probable dates for a hurricane occurring mid-August to early October. Thunderstorms occur almost every month of the year but are most severe July to September. The Florida Bay is also the waterspout capital of the world, experiencing 40 to 550 waterspouts per year; they are most common May through October.

ISLAMORADA

Islamorada is widely regarded as the sportfishing capital of the world with two area seas brimming with inhabitants ready for the taking. Sailfish, tuna, bonefish and tarpon are just a few of the local inhabitants, as well as hundreds of other sought-after game fish. If observation is more your game, Islamorada has massive reefs and the bay itself to explore and photograph.

History

All the Keys share a similar history; however, the rocks surrounding Islamorada (as well as the other islands) led Ponce de Leon to call the area "Los Martieres" or "The Martyrs." De Leon wrote, "... the rocks, from far away, appeared to be men in the throes of suffering." The name stuck, mainly due to the sheer volume of ships wrecked on the rocky shoals and the men lost at sea when the aforementioned vessels sank.

Attractions

See the Eagle, an intentionally sunk ship that serves as a dive attraction. The Windley Key was once two islands known as the Umbrella Keys. The water between was filled in, resulting in one island with a center of loosely sedimented rock. The main quarry complex is now a Florida Park Service geological site. The quarry was once the location of Mizner Industries (1928), a service that would channel out fossilized coral and ship it to Miami, where it would be finished into a marble-like product. The process involved a channeling machine — a gasoline-powered, track-run chiseling device that would essentially separate the rock so that it could be cut and cubed in large volume. The rusted skeleton of the channeling machine still stands on the northernmost rim of the quarry. The area also houses the Theater of the Sea, which gives adults and children the chance to swim with dolphins, as well as snorkeling and viewing of indigenous wildlife. At Lignumvitae Key State Botanical Site, you can ascend to the highest elevation in the Keys — a staggering 18 feet.

KEY LARGO

The northernmost island on the Key, Largo is only 50 miles from two of Florida's major airports. Largo is located between the Everglades in the west and North America's only living coral reef to the east.

History

Key Largo has a well-deserved title as the "Dive Capital of the World" because of its large steps in marine conservation. In 1960, the John Pennekamp Coral Reef Park, the first conservatory of its kind, opened followed by the Key Largo National Marine Sanctuary 15 years later. Statues, ships and reefs abound in the waters surrounding Key Largo, with many educational and entertaining opportunities.

Attractions

In addition to the John Pennekamp Coral Reef Park and the National Marine Sanctuary, Key Largo hosts a wealth of diving opportunities. You can explore Bibb and Duane, dual 327-foot U.S. Coast Guard cutters, intentionally sunk in 1987 to attract divers of beginner to veteran status, as a safe dive site. The Benwood wreck, sunk in an attack during World War II, provides a firsthand glimpse of how schools of fish will thrive in a man-made environment, as swarms of grunt and porkfish (in addition to many others) call this ship home. Likewise, Spiegel Grove, a 510-foot Navy vessel, was intentionally sunk in the summer of 2002 to add yet another controlled dive location. Lastly, Christ of the Abyss is an easily accessible Largo landmark, cast in bronze; it is sandwiched between the Dry Rocks coral formation in a shallow 25 feet of water.





If diving isn't your game, Largo's proximity to the Everglades makes it a prime location for kayakers, photographers, bird-watchers and other nature-minded people. On the island itself, many art galleries have opened and with them several gourmet restaurants as well as pubs, hotels and shops for when the sun goes down.

MARATHON

Located in the middle of the Keys, Marathon is known for its delicate balance of booming industry and beautiful natural surroundings. It not only offers several well-maintained public beaches but also a modern airport as well as a nationally recognized harbor (Boot Key Harbor), boasting many different marine activities. Marathon is also home to the Dolphin Research Center and Turtle Hospital, both known worldwide as specialist centers for marine-fauna rescue and conservation.

History

Marathon's most well-documented trait is its standing as a fishing village. The Golden Age of Marathon was in the 19th and early 20th centuries, where it was the premier location of fishing imports for Florida. Flagler's Railroad figures heavily into the history of Marathon - the railroad was an extension from Florida proper into the Keys; the route went through the Everglades, over open water and into the Keys. Flagler's project broke ground in 1906 and employed the assistance of several unskilled laborers. The task was daunting and was projected to take five to six years with an estimated cost of \$50 million. During construction, many of the laborers resided in Pigeon Key (a small isle in the presentday Marathon area). The project was completed in January 1912. However, in 1935, after 23 years of problem-free service, a giant tidal wave overtook the train on its stop in Homestead (a small station after Islamorada). The wave washed the train (and most of the village) out to sea. Days later, more than 500 casualties were found, but the real headcount still remains unknown. The route was never rebuilt.

Attractions

As mentioned earlier, Marathon boasts two renowned conservation facilities, the Dolphin Research Center and Turtle Hospital. It also has Crane Point Hammock, a 64-acre protected reserve of walking trails, museums and historic sites. Diving and snorkeling your fancy? Try Sombrero Reef, North America's only living coral barrier reef. The reef is part of the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary. The island also has a modern hospital, as well as several dining and shopping hotspots.

BIG PINE AND LOWER KEYS

The Lower Keys are Florida's best-kept secret. They have been the getaway spot for more than 75 years. The islands are home to earthy mangrove forests as well as miles of unspoiled beaches. The area is also known for calm, warm diving water away from the more commercial dive areas.

History

Big Pine had humble beginnings, most notably as a post-Depression shark-processing center. Workers would catch sharks, skin them and send their meat and skins north to Miami and New Jersey, respectively. Due to its relatively short shelf life, shark meat rarely made it north of Georgia. The skins, however, were a stronger alternative to traditional leather; sharkskin was tougher than cowhide and, once it was cured, was stronger still — a material called shagreen. The material became popular with shoemakers and garment makers, though somewhat more costly than cowhide.

The multitude of Lower Keys (Little Torch, Cudjoe, Sugarloaf and Summerland, among others) each have their own individual histories, and many offer localized museums and traditional restaurants in addition to many specialty shops.

Attractions

The Lower Keys are home to many quiet resorts and single-family homes, in addition to RV campgrounds and picnic areas. Big Pine is the area's "designated" shopping district, with several specialty shops as well as general goods and services. Little Duck Key (upper half of the Lower Keys) offers Veterans Memorial





Park — pet-friendly, sandy beaches and a multitude of picnic areas — the perfect choice for a family day getaway. Bahia Honda Key, located a few miles away, has Bahia Honda State Park, another perfect camping and picnicking area with beaches that often make the Top 10 lists of beautiful beaches in the country, for many magazines. Looe Key is the diving destination, with several possibilities for diving and snorkeling the Looe coral reef. The Looe coral reef is home to the annual Underwater Music Festival — an offbeat multimedia display. Previous highlights included a troupe of snorkeling, guitar-playing Elvises, an underwater art gallery, an underwater masked ball (complete with "costumed" dancers) and a "Divas of the Deep" exhibit, featuring sirens who "sang" along with the orchestra. In addition to the traditional broadcast, the festival is projected into the deep, via speakers mounted beneath a flotilla of pontoon boats. Visit www.lowerkeyschamber.com for more information.

THE ISLAND CITY



As you reach the last major island of the Florida Keys, you are entering the very southernmost city of the continental United States. Key West measures 1.5 miles by 4 miles. It is 93 miles north of Cuba and 153 miles southwest of Miami at 24.5 degrees above the equator. It's tropical throughout the year with a history of frost-free weather.

Additionally, Key West history hints of Spanish explorers, 19th-century pirates, shipwrecks and prospering salvagers, cigar factories, sponge diving, shrimp fleets and visitors ranging from U.S. presidents to homeless wanderers. The Navy has been present on Key West since 1823.

Key West is connected to the mainland by the Overseas Highway (U.S. Highway 1), which was built on the old roadbed of the Florida East Coast Railway. The railway, built in 1902, was destroyed by a hurricane in 1935. Emerald-colored waters where the Gulf of Mexico and the Atlantic Ocean meet below the 42 bridges of the Overseas Highway make the drive between Miami and Key West especially beautiful.

Surrounding the Island City, 5 miles offshore, is the last living coral reef of the North American continent. Acting as a breakwater, the southernmost barrier reef reduces wave action, which normally washes sand ashore in other regions.

Along with a brilliant assortment of life forms, more than 600 varieties of edible fish can be found in the local waters including tarpon, amberjack, dolphin, king mackerel and many others. Fishing follows tourism as the secondmost important industry of the island.

Drinking water once consisted solely of what rainwater could be caught from the rooftops and stored in backyard cisterns. Today, fresh water for the island is obtained from an 18-inch pipeline that was originally built by the Navy in 1942, subsequently sold to the county, and a


desalination plant that was reportedly the largest in the world when it was built in 1967.

Along Front Street and Duval Street on the western part of the city, there are at least 50 stores that range from native "Conch," Cuban and more conventional restaurants and bakeries, to English pubs and handicraft shops for gold and silver, candle-making and glassblowing, plus art galleries and antique shops. In Key West, one can buy fire-glazed ceramics, palm frond baskets and hats, homemade leather sandals and numerous other crafts practiced locally.

Sunset is observed here with deep reverence and a rare harmony that draws newcomers, tourists, locals, the finely dressed and the notso-dressed all together at the same place and time. An hour or so before the sun drops magnificently below the Gulf horizon, people from all parts of the island gather at Mallory Square on Front Street to enjoy the impromptu collection of fire eaters, jugglers, Congo drum players, iguana displays, dancers and banjo pickers. Just as the sun melts the sky into a liquid flame and slips below the water's far edge, all is quiet along the wall — as if this natural wonder will never take place or be seen again. The inevitable round of applause from all onlookers eventually breaks the magic spell, however, and everyone steps into motion again to see what else there is to discover on this island of contrasts, personality and tropical beauty.








EVERGLADES NATIONAL PARK

About a five-hour drive up Overseas Highway 1 from Key West, the Everglades National Park encompasses more than 1.5 million acres of diverse ecological preserves and is the only subtropical wilderness area in the United States. A co-mingling of both fresh and saltwater, the Everglades Ecosystem is resplendent with rare and endangered species and offers numerous opportunities for exploring. Camping, hunting, fishing, canoeing, kayaking, hiking, biking, boating, swimming, diving and snorkeling are just some of the ways one can experience the multivariate natural wonders of this designated World Heritage site.

Once covered by an ancient sea, the Everglades are now home to much of the remaining wildlife in South Florida. With a blend of temperate and tropical climates, the Everglades display a menagerie of plant and animal species that coexist nowhere else on the planet. This includes more than 360 documented species of birds, 300 species of fish, 40 species of mammals and 1,000 species of plants. Unfortunately, some of the most famous creatures in the Everglades are also threatened or endangered. These include the leatherback turtle, West Indian manatee and Florida panther.

Best visited during the dry winter months of January through April - when free from summer's oppressive heat, 90 percent humidity, rampant mosquitoes and potential hurricanes - the region reveals a vast spectrum of ecosystems. Some of the distinct habitats include mangrove stands, pine rocklands, hardwood hammocks, cypress swamps, freshwater sloughs, marine estuaries and the famous sawgrass marshes. Additionally, the porous limestone foundation beneath the Everglades serves as an aquifer, filtering and capturing fresh water as a source for the remainder of the state.

The Everglades National Park is home to the largest contiguous stand of salt-tolerant mangroves anywhere in the U.S. Found along the coastal tides where fresh water meets salt, one can canoe under their canopies, watching wading birds feed and nest. These stilt-rooted mangroves are also Florida's first line of defense against hurricanes. With a backcountry camping permit, one can chart a course through the 99-mile Wilderness Waterway route between Flamingo and Everglade City. The excursion can take as little as six hours by motorboat or up to seven days via canoe.

The Pineland, or "pine rocklands" is a region of slash pines whose roots take hold in the limestone and produce a vast canopy under which an incredible plethora of flora thrive. Fire has always been an important component of this region, serving to oust the faster-growing hardwoods before they can block the sun from pine seedlings. Normally, natural causes like lightning served to spark the forests, but nowadays rangers use controlled burns to keep the pinelands healthy.

What once was the "river of grass" - a vast, sheet-like, slow-flowing (100 feet per day), freshwater river region, measuring 60 miles wide and 100 miles long, from Lake Okeechobee to Florida Bay - is now 25 percent of its former size. Seventeen hundred miles of canals and deepened rivers, constructed in the mid-20th century to stymie the flood burden of the Southern state, actually led to an accelerated deterioration of the once fertile wetlands. While trying to make conditions more hospitable to human life, the drainage efforts inflicted a double detriment to the natural realm — losing more than a billion gallons of freshwater a day to the sea, the prairies and marshes, with their indigent supporting biosphere, subsequently dried out, were consumed in fires and lost forever. The Everglades National Park system was founded with the mission of conserving the precious remnants of this once bounteous wild.

BIG CYPRESS NATIONAL PRESERVE

Spanning 720,000 acres of freshwater swamp, the Big Cypress National Preserve is also the best place for spotting some of Florida's most famous creatures such as the American alligator and the endangered Florida panther. The cypress was known as "the wood eternal" because of the element-resistant qualities it develops as a result of being grown in standing water. While not actually harboring any individual big cypress trees, the area was instead named for its vast expanse of cypress trees — hundreds of thousands of acres — lining the estuaries. Today, visitors enjoy camping, fishing, hunting and boating here. Unlike most preserves that are ecological sanctuaries for their flora and fauna, the Big Cypress region makes allowances for off-road vehicle use like airboats, swamp buggies and allterrain vehicles.

Furthermore, with the aim of maintaining the ecosystem's integrity in perpetuity, Big Cypress National Preserve also permits hunting. As part of a long-standing tradition in the region, hunters pursue white-tailed deer, turkey and hogs with separate seasons for archery, muzzleloaders and general guns. However, the hunting of alligators is not permitted. Viewing platforms are provided to witness the large groups of gators congregating from January through May, though all are advised to respect the large reptiles by not feeding them and by keeping a safe distance.

DRY TORTUGAS NATIONAL PARK

Seventy miles west of Key West and accessible only by boat or plane, Dry Tortugas National Park is a striking example of beauty. First discovered by Ponce de Leon in 1513, the seven-island chain of sand and coral shoals once teemed with giant sea turtles (tortugas) yet lacked any freshwater source, hence: dry. The military






commissioned the construction of 450-cannon Fort Jefferson — strategically located in the Florida Straits — in 1846 but, due to the advent of the rifled cannon, the fort was obsolete before it was completed. The region is also part of a 46-squaremile preserve called the Research Natural Area. This no-take, no-anchor preserve ensures that endangered game fish have a sanctuary from detrimental commercial overfishing and that the island's deteriorating coral reefs have an undisturbed refuge for scientific research. Park visitors can enjoy fishing, boating, swimming, snorkeling and scuba diving in the pristine subtropical coral community, regarded as one of the most well-preserved marine areas in the Florida Keys.

EVERGLADES ALLIGATOR FARM

Founded in 1982 as an airboat ride attraction, Everglades Alligator Farm expanded into commercial alligator farming after state approval in 1985 as a means to preserve the then-endangered American alligator. Everglades Alligator Farm features more than 2,000 gators at different stages of development exhibited in various grow-out pens and breeding ponds. Feedings and wrangling demonstrations take place daily, and the farm still features exciting airboat rides through the grassy wetlands to observe





the reptiles in their natural habitat. In addition to gators, the park is also home to caimans, crocodiles and other reptiles. Happily, since the legalization of alligator farming undercut the necessity for poaching, the gator population has risen back to 1.5 million. The park is open 9 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. daily, and admission is \$28 for adults (\$21.00 for children), which includes an airboat ride, farm access and shows.

MONKEY JUNGLE

Just off Highway 1 in south Dade County and a little more than three hours from Key West, Monkey Jungle is a genuine wilderness ecosystem that is home to nearly 400 primates comprising 30 species. Founded by naturalist Joe DuMond on an expansive 30-acre hardwood hammock, or raised hill, the Monkey Jungle assists in the conservation of endangered apes while allowing visitors to experience the uncaged primates in their wild natural habitat. The primate population includes Java macaques, orangutans, gorillas, gibbons, howler monkeys, squirrel monkeys and spider monkeys.

After visitors were attacked by the fiercely territorial crab-eating Java monkeys, DuMond couldn't bring himself to cage the primates so he had pathways carved through the terrain encased in wire tunnels. This gave rise to the jungle's motto of "where humans are caged and monkeys run wild."

Monkey Jungle includes North America's only seminatural tropical Amazonian rainforest. As a complete ecosystem with predators such as hawks, raccoons and snakes, some monkeys are hunted as prey while other carnivorous monkeys will catch and eat baby raccoons and opossums. Daily feedings showcase the monkeys' skin-diving prowess as they plunge into pools to retrieve fruit thrown by park guides. Admission is \$29.95 for adults, \$27.95 for seniors and \$23.95 for children ages 3 to 9; the jungle is open 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily.



ZOO MIAMI

Zoo Miami covers more than 740 acres and contains more than 3,000 animals, representing more than 500 species, more than 40 of which are endangered. The zoo is also home to more than 70 species of birds, more than 1,000









types of plants, including hundreds of stunning orchids. Among the ranks of fauna are lions, tigers, crocodiles, elephants, gorillas, rhinoceroses, koalas, komodo dragons and the iconic pink flamingos. Feed a giraffe, camel, parrot or even a rhino. Explore on foot or take advantage of the air-conditioned, elevated monorail or a behind-the-scenes guided tram tour. The park is open 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily (except for special holiday hours), and admission is \$22.95 for an adult (\$18.95 for children ages 3 to 12), with special discounts available.

JUNGLE ISLAND

Formerly known as Parrot Jungle, Jungle Island is now an 18-acre, green-engineered tropical jungle that is home to hundreds of tropical birds, 2,000 species of plants and flowers, and lays claim to one of the best-trained bird show in the world. Jungle Island traces its origins to when Austrian immigrant Franz Scherr opened a feed supply store and realized that people would pay to see his trained and friendly birds. As an acquaintance of Monkey Jungle founder, Joe DuMond, Scherr was inspired enough to start his own jungle where birds could "fly free." Today, Jungle Island houses fish, reptiles, primates and mammals. Jungle Island is open every day of the year: 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily. Admission is \$52.95 for adults and \$39.95 for children ages 3 to 10, with discounts available. Jungle Island is located in the heart of Miami, off Interstate 395 between downtown Miami and South Beach.






